Discussion Model 2

One Secondary School and Three Primary Schools

This model would realign the 7 primary schools with the realignment of the RC Church Parishes, creating three primary schools.

- Retain St David's High School in its current location with pupils attending from Midlothian and East Lothian
- St David's and St Luke's would combine to form the school for St David's Parish based in Dalkeith or Mayfield/Easthouses
- St Mary's St Andrew's and St. Mathews would combine to form the school for St Matthew's Parish and be based in the new St Mary's school building
- Sacred Heart and St Margaret's would combine to form the school for St Margaret's parish based in the Sacred Heart School building

Catchment areas for each of the three denominational primary schools would be redrawn so as to optimize the distribution of pupils and minimize distances for pupils from home to school.

Discussion Model 3

One Secondary School and four Primary Schools

This model would:

- Retain St David's High School in its current location with pupils attending from Midlothian and East Lothian
- St David's Primary school would be retained on its existing site in Dalkeith
- St Andrew's and St Luke's would merge and be based in Gorebridge at the St Andrew's Primary School site
- St Margaret's and St Mary's would merge and be based in the new St Mary's school building in Bonnyrigg
- Sacred Heart would be retained in Penicuik and St Matthews would be retained in Rosewell under current shared headship arrangements with Sacred Heart

Catchment areas for each of the four denominational primary schools would be redrawn so as to optimize the distribution of pupils and minimize distances for pupils from home to school.

Discussion Model 4

One all through school plus three primary schools in another location

This Model would:

- Retain St David's High School in its current location with pupils attending from Midlothian and East Lothian
- St David's and St Luke's would merge into one primary school and be located on St David's High School campus
- St Andrew's would be retained in Gorebridge
- St Margaret's, St Mary's and St Matthews would merge into one primary school and be based in the new St Mary's school building in Bonnyrigg
- Sacred Heart would be retained in Penicuik

Discussion Model 5

One Secondary School and four primary schools based around the current geographic learning community areas

This model would:

- Retain St David's High school in its current location with pupils attending from Midlothian and East Lothian
- St David's Primary School and St Luke's would merge and be based on the current St David's Primary School campus (Dalkeith/St David's Learning Community)
- St Andrew's would be retained (Newbattle Learning Community)
- St Margaret's, St Matthew's and St Mary's would merge and be based in the new St Mary's school building in Bonnyrigg (Lasswade Learning Community)
- Sacred Heart would be retained in Penicuik (Penicuik/Beeslack Learning Community)

Catchment areas for each of the four denominational primary schools would be redrawn so as to optimize the distribution of pupils and minimize distances for pupils from home to school.

Discussion Model 6

One shared campus with secondary & primary school plus two primary schools in other locations

This model would:

- Retain St David's High School in its current location with pupils attending from Midlothian and East Lothian
- 3 denominational primary schools (St David's, St Andrew's and St Luke's) would merge into one primary school and be located on St David's High School campus
- 3 denominational primary schools (St Matthew's, St Margaret's, St Mary's) would merge into one primary school and be located in the new St Mary's school building in Bonnyrigg
- Sacred Heart would be retained in Penicuik

Catchment areas for each of the three denominational primary schools would be redrawn so as to optimize the distribution of pupils and minimize distances for pupils from home to school.

Discussion Model 7

One all through school plus one primary school in another location

This model would:

- Retain St David's High School in its current location with pupils attending from Midlothian and East Lothian
- 3 denominational primary schools (St David's, St Andrew's and St Luke's) would merge into one primary school and be located on St David's High School campus
- 4 primary schools (St Matthew's St Margaret's, St Mary's and Sacred Heart) would merge into one primary school and be located in the new St Mary's school building in Bonnyrigg

Catchment areas for each of the denominational primary schools would be redrawn so as to optimize the distribution of pupils and minimize distances for pupils from home to school.

Discussion Model 8

All Through Model – one all through school

This model would:

- Retain St David's High School in its current location with pupils attending from Midlothian and East Lothian
- Merge the 7 denominational primary schools into one primary school and be located on St David's High School campus.
