

## Fairy Tale Learning Map

### Jack and the Beanstalk

<p><b>I can listen actively to a whole story.</b> <b>I can listen to and talk about stories and other texts.</b> <b>I can make marks that relate to my play.</b></p> <p>Listen to the story of Jack and the Beanstalk together. Have a chat together about what you think the moral of the story was. Story Link: <a href="https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=-l_GG5gYZ8c">https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=-l_GG5gYZ8c</a></p> <p><i>When Jack was in the giant’s castle how did he feel?</i> <i>When Jack got the golden hen how did he feel?</i> You could draw faces to represent how he felt and label the emotions.</p> <p><i>Do you think Jack was right to speak to a stranger?</i> Discuss.</p> <p><i>Can you retell the story?</i> Use props such as; small stones or pebbles for beans, eggs or your own crafted beanstalk.</p> <p><i>What is your favourite part of the story?</i> Draw a picture of your favourite part of the story and ask an adult to write down your story thoughts and feelings.</p>	<p><b>Explore objects and use language of measure large/small.</b></p> <p>Can you draw a giant’s foot print? Can you measure it? Is it bigger or smaller, wider or thinner than your foot?</p> <p>Can you find or make big footprints and small footprints?</p> <p>Can you make a paperchain beanstalk by using strips of paper and linking them together? Can you measure it to see how long it is?</p> <p>Jack swaps his cow for five beans. Can you count to five using beads, grapes or anything you can find in the house?</p>	<p>Jack climbed up the leaves, can you collect some leaves or sticks from the garden or near your house and make a picture of a beanstalk?</p> <p>Can you play hide and seek the same as Jack when he hid from the giant?</p> <p>When out for a walk, can you spot any animals from the story? How many can you see?</p> <p><b>Life skills</b> <b>I am developing my self-help skills e.g. putting on/taking off clothing and using fastenings.</b></p> <p><i>Can you help clear your plate?</i> <i>Can you put your toys away?</i> <i>Can you brush your teeth?</i> <i>Can you wash your hands for 20 seconds with soap and warm water?</i></p>															
	<p><b>Science/Technology</b></p> <p>Grow a broad bean. Place the seed in a yogurt pot with some compost and a water. Measure how high it can grow Grow some cress seeds.
